Principal investigator (PI)	Yes	List a single principal investigator (PI) who is a U.S. person that will be responsible to the offeror’s organization for the scientific and technical direction of the project. CASIS can only accept proposals from and award projects to U.S. persons (as defined below). The offeror may have non-U.S. persons on the team as subcontractors or participants, but the offeror’s organization (or entity), the PI, and the co-PI must all qualify as U.S. persons.
PI email	Yes	Provide the email address of the PI. An email address is required to submit a Step 2: Full Proposal.
PI phone	Yes	Provide the PI’s telephone number.
PI position/title	No	Provide the PI’s position or title.
PI citizenship status	Yes	A U.S. person is a natural person who is a lawful permanent resident as defined in 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(20) or who is a protected individual as defined by 8 U.S.C. 1324b(a)(3). It also means any corporation, business association, partnership, society, trust, or any other entity, organization, or group that is incorporated to do business in the U.S. It also includes any governmental (federal, state, or local) entity.

Key words	Yes	Enter the most relevant words that describe the proposed project. (255-character limit)
Project objectives	Yes	In one or two paragraphs, describe the technology advancement being addressed. State the main research or technology development question and the goal of the project, then describe the project objectives. Be sure to address the project relevancy to the ISS National Lab mission, why the proposed work requires microgravity or the space environment, and whether the project builds on prior ISS research. (1,400-character limit)

Rationale for the ISS	Yes	Clearly describe where gravity is impeding progress on Earth, where space has been shown to produce relevant superior outcomes, and what properties are sought from in-orbit development. (1,000-character limit)
Commercial applications and other Earth benefits	Yes	Summarize anticipated project outcomes and their terrestrial value. Describe how successful results would contribute to potential future commercial applications and/or public benefits, noting the market size or projected reach. Identify the organization that will commercialize the resulting product and/or application and describe how the commercialization efforts will be funded. Please cite the sources for any market size numbers, market value, population affected, or other statistics. (1,400-character limit)
Suppliers of support and/or commitment letters		If the offeror has received letters of commercial support or letters of commitment from collaborators, list the names of those organizations (or individuals) here. The offeror must attach the letters of support to the main proposal pdf.
